12	Subtitle 3. Special Funds.
13	SECTION 11.301. COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AND REPAIR FUND.
14	(A) "FUND" DEFINED. IN THIS SECTION, "FUND" MEANS THE COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AND
15	Repair Fund.
16	(B) ESTABLISHED. IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 1-322 OF THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AND
17	CANNABIS ARTICLE OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND, THE COUNTY'S COMMUNITY
18	REINVESTMENT AND REPAIR FUND IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED AS A DEDICATED, SPECIAL FUND.
19	(C) Purpose. The Purpose of the Fund is to provide funds to community-based
20	ORGANIZATIONS THAT SERVE COMMUNITIES DETERMINED BY THE OFFICE OF SOCIAL EQUITY, IN
21	CONSULTATION WITH THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, TO HAVE BEEN THE MOST
22	IMPACTED BY DISPROPORTIONATE ENFORCEMENT OF THE CANNABIS PROHIBITION BEFORE JULY $1$ ,

24	(D) STATUS.
25	(1) THE FUND IS A DEDICATED, SPECIAL FUND.
26	(2) THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE SHALL HOLD THE FUND SEPARATELY.
27	(3) Any interest earnings of the Fund shall be credited to the Fund.
28	(E) PERMISSIBLE USES. THE FUND MAY ONLY BE USED FOR:
29	(1) FUNDING COMMUNITY-BASED INITIATIVES INTENDED TO BENEFIT LOW-INCOME
30	COMMUNITIES;

1	(2) FUNDING COMMUNITY-BASED INITIATIVES THAT SERVE DISPROPORTIONATELY
2	IMPACTED AREAS, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 36-101 OF THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AND
3	CANNABIS ARTICLE OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND; OR
4	(3) Any related administrative expenses
5	(F) Prohibited Uses. Money in the Fund:
6	(1) MAY NOT BE EXPENDED FROM THE FUND FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES OR
7	ACTIVITIES.
8	(2) IS SUPPLEMENTAL TO AND MAY NOT SUPPLANT FUNDING THAT OTHERWISE WOULD BE
9	APPROPRIATED FOR PREEXISTING LOCAL GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS.

12	Subtitle 24. Adult-Use Cannabis.
13	
14	Section 12.2400. Adult-Use Cannabis Advisory Panel.
15	(a) General Provisions. General provisions applicable to the Advisory Panel are set forth in
16	subtitle 3, "Boards and Commissions," of Title 6, "County Executive and the Executive Branch"
17	of this Code.
18	(b) Purpose. The purpose of the Advisory Panel is to study the implementation of adult-use
19	cannabis in the County and make recommendations on how the County can promote health,
20	public safety, business, and social and racial equity in the adult-use market.
21	(c) Number of Members. The Advisory Panel shall consist of a minimum of [[12]]16 members
22	and a maximum of [[20]]24 members.
23	(d) Membership. The Advisory Panel shall be comprised of:
24	(1) The following NON-VOTING ex officio members;
25	(i) The County Chief of Police, or the Chief's designee;
26	(ii) The State's Attorney, or the State's Attorney's designee;
27	(iii)The Executive Director of the Economic Development Authority, or the CEO's
28	designee;
29	(iv) The Director of the Department of Planning and Zoning, or the Director's designee;

1	[[and]]
2	(v) The Health Officer, or the Health Officer's designee[[.]]; AND
3	(VI) THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE OFFICE OF HUMAN RIGHTS AND EQUITY OR THE
4	Administrator's Designee.
5	(2) The following appointed members who live or are employed in Howard County:
6	(i) At least three members that have substantial experience in one or more of the
7	following:
8	1. Cannabis law, science, or policy;
9	2. Public health or health care;
10	3. Agriculture;
11	4. Local business;
12	5. Finance; or
13	6. Addiction treatment;
14	(ii) At least two members who have or have had State licenses to operate cannabis
15	dispensaries, processing facilities, growing facilities, or on-site consumption facilities
16	in Howard County;
17	(iii)At least one member who represents an organization that advocates on behalf of
18	patients who engage in the medical use of cannabis; [[and]]
19	(iv)At least one member who represents an organization that advocates on behalf of
20	consumers who engage in the adult use of cannabis[[.]];
21	(v) At least one member who resides in the $21044$ area code; and
22	(VI) AT LEAST ONE MEMBER WHO RESIDES IN THE 21045 AREA CODE.
23	(e) Method of Appointment. Each appointed member shall be appointed by the County Executive
24	and confirmed by the Council.
25	(f) Terms. Appointed members of the board shall serve overlapping terms of three years or until
26	a successor is confirmed as provided in section 6.300 of this Code.
27	(g) Staff. The County Executive shall designate personnel to serve as staff support for the Board
28	(h) Meetings. The Advisory Panel shall meet at least quarterly per year.
29	(i) Duties. The Advisory Panel shall:

1	(1) Review data and analyze the implementation of adult-use cannabis in Howard County,
2	including the effects on citizens of the County with respect to health, public safety, land
3	use, business, and social and racial equity in the adult-use market;
4	(2) Study best practices from other jurisdictions;
5	(3) Act as an advocate on behalf of the panel on issues related to adult-use cannabis;
6	(4) Undertake activities which will educate and increase public awareness of changes in State
7	law;
8	(5) Monitor the development of an equitable and safe adult-use cannabis market; [[and ]]
9	(6) Propose actions the County Executive and County Council can take to best guide the
10	adult-use cannabis market[[.]]AND;
11	(7) REGARDING THE COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AND REPAIR FUND ESTABLISHED PURSUANT
12	TO SECTION 1-322 OF THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AND CANNABIS ARTICLE OF THE
13	Annotated Code of Maryland and Section 11.301 of this Code, the Panel shall
14	ADVISE THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE AND COUNTY COUNCIL ON THE USE OF FUNDS IN THE
15	COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AND REPAIR FUND FOR THE UPCOMING FISCAL YEAR.
16	(j) Annual Report. On or before [[July 1]] FEBRUARY 1 of each year, the Advisory Panel shall
17	submit an annual report which shall comply with the requirements of section 22.1000 of this
18	Code to the HOWARD COUNTY DELEGATION, THE County Council and the County Executive on
19	its activities during the previous calendar year. The report may include recommendations on any
20	matter related to the work of the Advisory Panel.
21	
22	Section 2. And Be It Further Enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, that
23	the first Report required by Section 12-2400(j) of the Howard County Code is due on or before
24	February 1, 2025.
25	
26	Section 3. And Be It Further Enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, that

this Act shall become effective 61 days after its enactment.
