Fiscal Impact:

There is no fiscal impact as a result of Council Resolution 43-2022.

While the resolution itself does not specifically have any fiscal impact, County revenues and expenditures will increase if the grant requests are approved. The grants generally require a local match of 10 to 25 percent.

Note that the "Expected County Match" in the table below exceeds the required match for all grants having a matching requirement. The Office of Transportation indicated the costs of these transportation programs have increased over time while the grant awards have not, resulting in the County's increased contribution. Our Office has noted that this trend of exceeding the required match amount for some awards is consistent with prior years.

The Office of Transportation further indicated that the required match percentage for capital grants decreased to 20 percent from the prior year.
